



Various Police Infrastructures Inaugurated

The newly built multi-million-dollar police infrastructures namely Oshikoto Police Regional Headquarters together with Omuthiya Police Station in Omuthiya town have been officially inaugurated.

The Oshikoto Police Regional Headquarters and Omuthiya Police Station in Oshikoto Region were inaugurated on Friday, 15 June 2018 by his Excellency Dr. Hage Geingob, President of the Republic of Namibia. In his inaugural speech, the President commended the Minister of Safety and Security and the Inspector-General of Police for their wise investment in infrastructure.

The new Omuthiya Police Station is under the leadership of Chief-Inspector Frieda M. Nandjato as the Station Commander. The facility is co-joined with the Oshikoto Police Regional Headquarters and it embraces members dwellings, a soccer pitch, a canteen, both netball and volleyball courts and a helipad.

“Although this was the first police facility to be inaugurated this year, more is to come, among them, the new edifice of the Police National Headquarters in Windhoek, whose construction is nearing completion. The purpose of constructing these structures is to ensure that effective administration of law enforcement is available nationwide” remarked the head of state.

Speaking at the same event, was the Inspector-General of Police Lieutenant-General Sebastian Haitota Ndeitunga who highlighted that police officers continue to lack office space and accommodation hence the need to prioritise infrastructures development.

Both inaugural ceremonies were presided under the theme; *“Enhancing Policing through Infrastructure Development”*.

At the other event, the Mayor of Windhoek, His Worship Muesee Kazapua inaugurated the Police Central Warehouse (PCW), in Windhoek, on the 21 June 2018. The Mayor called for the safeguard of these infrastructures so as to preserve them for future genera-
